## **Hanover once again the most successful breeding association Federal Championships in Warendorf**

**Verden. The breeders of the Hannoveraner Verband were already the most successful ones at the 2016 Olympics in Rio de Janeiro. Now horses registered with the Hannoveraner Verband won by far most of the medals at the German Federal Championships on the first weekend of September, resulting in 13 noble metal medals in all three disciplines for Hanoverian and Rhenish horses. 13 German horse breeding associations in total were represented at the Federal Championships. More than 1/3 of all medals awarded in Warendorf were given to Hanoverian or Rhenish horses, complemented by numerous top placements that underscore the overall success. This highlights one more time - as it already did in Rio de Janeiro: many fantastic careers start at the auctions of the Hannoveraner Verband in Verden.**

Desperados FRH and Kristina Bröring-Sprehe won gold and bronze in Rio de Janeiro. His son Destacado (breeder: Heinrich Gießelmann, Barver) now dominated the youngest division in Warendorf when he won the gold medal with Pascal Kandziora in the division of three-year-old stallions. Silver went to Brasilia by Benicio/Lauries Crusador xx (breeder: Eibe Icken, Dorum) under Anja Duetsch and bronze to Farosa PS by Fürst Romancier/Sarkozy (breeder: Gestüt Lewitz, Mühlen) under Anja Engelbart in the division of three-year-old mares and geldings.

Horses bred by Hanoverian breeders won all medals in the division of four-year-old stallions: Don Martillo by Don Juan de Hus/Benetton Dream (breeder: Axel Windeler, Verden) and Ann-Christin Wienkamp won the gold medal. Bon Coeur by Benetton

Dream/Sandro Hit (breeder: Birgit Tietjen, Taaken) repeated last year's success and won the silver medal with his rider Christin Schütte. Bronze went to the Rhenish horse Villeneuve by Vitalis/Dancier (breeder: Edeltraut Hähn, Bergneustadt) with Laura Strobel. The bronze medal for Quizmaster by Quasar de Charry/Velten Third (breeder: Klaus Küver, Lamstedt) with his Luxembourg rider Sascha Schulz complemented the Hanoverian success in the riding horse arena.

The Hanoverian-Rhenish alliance won both gold medals at the dressage horse championships. The Rhenish mare Deluxe by Don Primus/Wolkentanz II (breeder: Janet Stratmann, Aachen) occupied the top place in the division of six-year-old horses with Laura Blackert. Lordswood Dancing Diamond by Dancier/Wolkenstein II (breeder: Heinrich Ebeling, Hollnseth) and Anne-Kathrin Pohlmeier shined in the division of five-year-old horses. She convincingly won the competition, scoring 10 for overall impression. Which is indeed hard to top. Apart from that, Nymphenburg's First Ampere by Ampere/Weltruhm (breeder: Jan Siemsglüss, Bomlitz) and Tessa Frank were awarded the bronze medal.

The event horses in the two age-groups were also decorated with medals. Silver went to Quirly by Quintender/Gloster (breeder: Andreas Schnackenberg, Buchholz) and Anja Siemer in the division of five-year-old horses. Classic Royetta by Royal Classic/Florestan (breeder: Gerhard de Vries, Zetel) and Stephanie Böhe won the bronze medal in the division of six-year-olds. The successful result was complemented by the bronze medal for Summersby by Stalypso/Landadel (breeder: Eberhart Wotte, Rhede) in his fight for fault and time in the division of seven-year-old jumpers.

Following these outstanding successes, everybody is now looking forward with anticipation to the 133<sup>rd</sup> Verden Elite Auction on October 8, 2016, and to the Verden Stallion Sales on October 29, 2016 when the medal winners of tomorrow will find their new owners.
